Heartbeat City

Side A

Side A

Stay The Night (Cetera/Foster)- It all begins with a slap. Cetera feels up a lady customer in the video, and he think she's misunderstanding his feelings. Heh. For those of you #metoo people out there, Cetera's truck blows up in the end, so there's a little vindication for you.
